A CRUCIAL YEAR AHEAD

TfL faces a critically important year with many projects committed to in the latest business plan being delivered.

Among the main projects coming to fruition for London Underground are:

- The launch of Night Tube in September
- The start of construction on the Northern line extension
- The opening of Tottenham Court Road's new ticket hall in January
- The completion of Vauxhall Station's modernisation.

There will be the continuation of changes that have already started with more S stock trains being introduced on the District line and the whole

customer experience is being transformed through the Fit for the Future - Stations programme.

It's a critical year for hitting the 30 per cent reliability improvement set by the Mayor of London.

It will also be a busy 12 months for London Rail with a new operator, having just taken over the running of the DLR and then, in May, London Rail will take over operations of West Anglia trains to Enfield, Chingford and Cheshunt. At the same time, the first phase of Crossrail will open between Shenfield and Liverpool Street, with TfL responsible for the service.

For buses there will be the challenge of maintaining reliability on the network with the development of the inner ring road and the introduction of new driver training with an emphasis on vulnerable road users.



PENSIONERS' FORUM SUMMARY

Main issues discussed at the meeting held on 19 November 2014

TfL Pension Fund:

It was noted that attendance at the Annual Members Meeting held on 24 October had been good and feedback positive. The Chairman advised that a copy of the presentation made at the meeting and details of the questions raised by members together with the answers given was to be posted on the Fund's website.

Pensioner Liaison Scheme:

The pensioners'

representatives were pleased to note that a number of people had recently expressed interest in becoming pensioner liaison representatives (PLRs). Discussion took place on ways of encouraging further interest from pensioners, especially in those areas where there were there were insufficient numbers of PLRs to provide good coverage.

Staff Travel:

The management representatives said they would continue to pursue with the Association of Train Operating Companies the need to reinforce to their revenue inspection staff the correct procedures to follow where pensioners were unable to obtain privilege facilities on National Rail when booking offices were closed. The pensioners' representatives were advised that TfL was planning to introduce the facility for privilege rate tickets to be purchased from TfL ticket machines.





Peter worked as a bus conductor at Hammersmith and Putney Garages for a total of 36 years.


John 'Paddy' Nordon 18 October 2014, aged 96
